Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport has made "The London (Waiting and Loading) (Restriction) (Amendment) (No. 7) Regulations, 1962", (S.I. 1962/1959) coming into operation on 14th September 1962.

These Regulations amend the London (Waiting and Loading) (Restriction) Regulations, 1961 (which impose restrictions on vehicles with regard to waiting, on methods of loading and unloading vehicles, on the sale of goods from vehicles and on the use of streets for advertising activities), so that the restrictions no longer apply in certain streets or parts of streets in Chelsea and Westminster.

In the streets where the restrictions no longer apply, other restrictions on vehicles as to waiting, loading and unloading now have effect by virtue of the Knightsbridge (Peak-hour Clearway) Regulations

1962 (S.I. 1962/1958).

Waiting Restrictions Croydon County Borough

Waiting Restrictions

City of London and Metropolitan Borough of Stepney

The Minister of Transport proposes to make Regulations under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, as amended, to restrict waiting by vehicles between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in that part of Middlesex Street lying within the City of London from a point 140 feet east of the southeastern kerb-line of Bishopsgate to the boundary of the Metropolitan Borough of Stepney, and to include the first 45 feet of Widegate Street and of Sandy's Row (west side); and between the hours of 8.30 a.m.

and 6.30 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in that part of Middlesex Street lying within the Metropolitan Borough of Stepney from the boundary of the City of London to a point 84 feet north-west of the northern kerb-line of Whitechapel High Street and to include the first 45 feet of Sandy's Row (east side), Strype Street, Cobb Street, Wentworth Street and New Couleten Street Cobb Street, Goulston Street.

Exemptions would be provided in the Regulations to permit vehicles to wait in order to pick up and set down passengers, to load and unload goods, to carry out essential services, or when used by local authorities in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
