*The Borough of Swindon (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit)  
(No. 2) Order, 1962*

On the 10th day of September 1962, the Minister of Transport confirmed the above-named Order made by the Swindon Borough Council under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is that no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 m.p.h. on that length of Marlborough Road (A.345) which extends from its intersection with the Swindon Borough boundary at Coate in a westerly direction for a distance of 790 yards.

This Order shall come into operation on Monday, 24th September 1962.

## CHESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Chester (Town Street and Lower Fold, Marple) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1962*

On the 10th September 1962, the Cheshire County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on the following lengths of road at Marple Bridge in the Urban District of Marple:

*Town Street*

West Side—From its junction with Hollins Lane to its junction with the Stockport—Glossop Road, A.626, at Marple Bridge.

East side—From its junction with Hollins Lane thence for a distance of 30 yards in a northerly direction.

*Stockport—Glossop Road, A.626 (Lower Fold)*

From its junction with Town Street thence for a distance of 20 yards in a north easterly direction.

This Order will come into operation on the 24th September 1962, and contains the usual exemptions to permit vehicles to wait for the purposes of loading or unloading goods, allowing persons to board or alight or to enable works to be carried out in the lengths of road.

## WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Warwick (Link Road from Cliffe Hill to Lakin Road, Warwick) (One-Way Streets) Order, 1962.*

On the 14th September 1962, the Warwickshire County Council made an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is to prohibit the driving of vehicles along the link road from Cliffe Hill to Lakin Road, Warwick, from its junction with the Stratford-upon-Avon—Coventry—Leicester Trunk Road, A.46, as follows:

along the northern arm of the carriageway for a distance of 45 yards, otherwise than in an easterly direction;

along the southern arm of the carriageway for a distance of 32 yards, otherwise than in a westerly direction.

The Order which came into operation on the 17th September 1962, does not apply to the driving of any mechanical road cleansing vehicle.
