

Act, 1959, appropriating certain existing roads at Urmston and Eccles in Lancashire as the special roads authorised to be provided by the County Council in pursuance of the Lancashire County Council (Stretford—Eccles By-Pass Special Road Connecting Roads) Special Roads Scheme, 1961, No. 1, for the purpose of connecting the Stretford—Eccles By-Pass Special Road with Stretford Road, Lostock Road, Barton Road and Liverpool Road.

Copies of the Appropriation Order and of the Plans referred to therein together with copies of the Confirmation Instrument are available for inspection at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Ministry of Transport, St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London S.E.1, and at the offices of the Lancashire County Council, the County Hall, Preston. The County Council have also made copies of the Order and plans available for inspection at the Council Offices, Urmston and The Town Hall, Eccles.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within six weeks of the 25th day of September 1962, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 19 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949 that by the Studland Heath Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1962, made on the 21st day of September 1962, the Nature Conservancy declared that all those pieces and parcels of land containing 429.00 acres or thereabouts situate in Studland in the County of Dorset and shown edged red on the

plan attached to the said Declaration have been acquired and are being held by the Nature Conservancy and are being managed as a Nature Reserve.
