TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS, 1944 AND 1947

Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way City of Plymouth

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 23 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, as incorporated with the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, has prepared in draft and proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over Compton Street, Compton Street Lane East, Compton Street Lane West, Duke Street, Norley Place, Park Lane and parts of Clarence Street, Park Street, Ebrington Street, Old Town Street and Tavistock Road, Plymouth.

Copies of the draft Order and of the map relative thereto showing the land over which the rights of way proposed to be extinguished subsist may be inspected at the Municipal Offices, Plymouth, without payment of fee during the usual office hours.

Any objection to this proposal must be made in writing, and addressed to the Minister of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, by the 28th day of December 1962.

The Minister is not, in all cases, required to cause a local inquiry to be held. It is important, therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made, as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.
