Copies of the Order and the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Council House, Aldridge, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 5th day of October 1962.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to confirmation of the Order.

STALYBRIDGE BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Stalybridge (Hague, Stonecliffe and Heyrod) Smoke Control Order, 1962

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Stalybridge in the County of Chester in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 26th day of September 1962, made an Order entitled "The Stalybridge (Hague, Stonecliffe and Heyrod) Smoke Control Order, 1962," declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of October 1963, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, 18 Stamford Street, Stalybridge, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 5th day of October 1962.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SMALLBURGH RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL
