The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of September 1962 (N.P. 1158/62) in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the Schedule to Order in Council (No. 44*/N.P.) of 11th May 1960, as amended by Order in Council (No. 74*/N.P.) of 18th April 1962, rates and conditions of award of service pensions, terminal grants and service gratuities have been laid down for Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Royal Navy and Royal Marines, Ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service and Members of the Naval Nursing Auxiliary Section of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that in consequence of the increased rates of pension authorised by Order in Council (No. 74*/N.P.) of 18th April 1962, the maximum rates of pension payable should also be increased:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction with effect from 1st April 1962, the amendment of Clause 13 of the Schedule to Order in Council (No. 44*/N.P.) of 11th May 1960, to read as follows:

"13. *Maximum Rates of Pension.* Rates of pension as provided for in Clauses 6 to 10 will be subject to a maxima of £13 10s. 0d. a week for men and £11 9s. 6d. a week for women. If additions are granted under Clauses 11 and 12 the maxima

will be £14 5s. 0d. a week for men and £12 6s. 6d. a week for women."

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
