ELIZABETH R.

GREETING!

Whereas We have taken into Our Royal consideration the need to mark the great constitutional change which has resulted in the independence of Uganda.

And whereas We are desirous that selected individuals in Uganda in Our Legislature, in Our Armed Forces, in Our Civil Service, in Our Police Force from among those in Local Government and engaged as Local Government employees or in voluntary social work should bear some form of recognition of this important event.

We do by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, institute and create a new Medal for Uganda.

Firstly: The Medal shall be designated and styled "The Uganda Independence Medal."

Secondly: The Medal shall be circular in shape, one and a quarter inches in diameter, of cupro-nickel and shall bear on the obverse Our Royal
