PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 28th day of November 1962.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in that part of the Churchyard of St. James's Church, Ramsden, in the County of Oxford, added by an extension of the Churchyard in 1927 and shown cross hatched on the plan annexed hereto, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 24th day of August, 1962, and duly published, been taken

into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:


Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in that part of the Churchyard of St. James's Church, Ramsden, in the County of Oxford, added by an extension of the Churchyard in 1927 and shown cross hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. James's Churchyard, Ramsden, Oxfordshire) Order, 1962.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of November, 1962 (N.P.4281/62) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider it expedient that married officers, seamen or marines accompanied, or to be accompanied, by their families at an overseas station shall be granted an advance of emoluments:

"And whereas we consider it necessary to make provision for the recovery of such advances:

"And whereas we consider it necessary to charge a premium on all such advances:
