# HONOURS AND AWARDS <br> CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD 

St. James's Palace, London S.W.1.

The Queen has been graciously pleased, on the advice of Her Majesty's Canadian Ministers, to give orders for the undermentioned award.

## Awarded the George Medal:

Glen Garry Frazer, Constable (now Corporal), Royal Canadian Mounted Police.
A masked bandit held up the Bank of Montreal at Terrace, B.C. The alarm was given and Constable Frazer, in uniform and armed, raced across the street and entered the front door of the bank. The bandit saw him and opened fire before he could draw his gun. Constable Frazer wounded by the bullets fell to the ground. The bandit then attempted to leave the bank with the money he had taken. As the bandit passed him, Constable Frazer raised himself sufficiently to grapple with the robber for his rifle. The bandit released his grip on the rifle and fled. He was apprehended a few moments later. Undoubtedly the fact that Constable Frazer was able to get possession of the rifle prevented further bloodshed. The bandit had 18 cartridges in his possession when he was arrested.

## THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868

The Governing Body of Winchestbr College having, on the 8th day of December 1962, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the abovenamed Act, made Statutes in the terms appended hereto amending the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statutes are hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.
And notice is hereby given that any person, body of persons or body corporate, authorised in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of the said Statutes.

## WINCHESTER COLLEGE

Statutes to amend section 2 of Statute $V$ concerning Fellows and Statute Vil concerning College Chapel and Religious Instruction.
We, the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, being the Governing Body of Winchester College, do hereby, in exercise of the powers of the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of the Acts amending the same, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, resolve and enact as follows:

Statute V.-Fellows
2. Every person elected or appointed to a Fellowship shall be duly qualified in the judgment of the persons or person by whom he is elected or appointed to take part in the government of the College as a place of religion, learning and education.
Statute VII.-College Chapel and Religious Instruction

1. The Chapel services and the religious instruction in the College shall be in accordance with the doctrines of the Church of England. This provision of this Statute shall not be annulled nor amended without the concurrence of the Visitor.
2. For the celebration of Divine Service in the College as heretofore, there shall be maintained by the College such a number of Chaplains, Lay Clerks and Quiristers as shall from time to time be determined by the Warden and Fellows.
3. The appointment, removal, remuneration and duties of the Chaplains, Lay Clerks, and Quiristers shall be determined from time to time by the Warden and Fellows.

In witness whereof the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College have caused their Common seal to be hereunto affixed this 8th day of December 1962. Sealed with the College Seal in pursuance of a Resolution passed at a Meeting of the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, duly convened and held this 8 th day of December 1962, and in the presence of
