The QUEEN has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm, bearing date the 24th instant, to confer the dignity of a Barony of the United Kingdom upon the Right Honourable Sir Norman Craven Brook, G.C.B., and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style and title of BARON NORMANBROOK, of Chelsea, in the County of London.

Under authority of a Royal Warrant, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, at Government House, Wellington, on 14th December 1962, conferred the honour of Knighthood upon the under-mentioned gentlemen:

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 1st February 1963, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £200,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th February 1963, to Saturday, the 9th February 1963, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which
