The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of December 1962 (N.P.4708/62) in the words following,

viz.:

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pensions or allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, or to the widow or relation of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine,

or relation of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we deem it expedient to provide for the increase of certain of these pensions and allowances to correspond, as nearly as may be, with the benefits provided, in the case of civil pensions, by the Pensions (Increase) Act 1962; and to make certain consequential adjustments in the minimum rates of pensions that may be awarded in future to the widows and children of deceased Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men:
