WINSFORD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Dealers in Old Metal and Marine Stores

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Home Affairs by an Order made on the 14th January 1963, entitled 'The Old Metal Dealers (Winsford) Order, 1963, has declared section 86 of the Public Health Acts Amendments Act, 1907 (which relates to dealers in old metal and marine stores), to be in force in the Urban District of Winsford in the county of Chester.

This section provides for:

- (i) The registration of every person who shall carry on business as a dealer in old metal or as a marine store dealer.
- (ii) The keeping of a book by each dealer giving the description and price of all articles purchased or otherwise acquired by him together with the name, address and occupation of the person from whom the same were purchased or otherwise acquired.
- (iii) The liability to a penalty not exceeding FIVE pounds and to a daily penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for failure to register or for not keeping such a book and making such entries as are required to be made.
- (iv) The free access at all reasonable times to any officer of the local authority or other person duly authorised in writing in that behalf by it to every registered place of business, warehouse, store or place of deposit, to inspect same and the books required to be kept. Every person who shall obstruct any officer in the performance of such duty shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding FIVE pounds.

RIVER BOARDS ACT, 1948

South West Wales River Board Byelaws

Notice is hereby given that the South West Wales River Board intend to apply at the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice for the confirmation by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food of a Byelaw made by the Board for securing the efficient discharge of their functions. The proposed Byelaw prescribes the new area where draft or seine nets may be used in fishing for salmon and trout in the Towy estuary and is in substitution for Byelaw 6(A) (3)(c) in the existing code of Byelaws. During a period of one calendar month from the date of publication of this notice a printed copy of the said Byelaw will be deposited at the Offices of the Board (as under) and will be open to public inspection, without charge, on any week day during the usual office hours. During the same period printed copies of the Byelaw will be supplied on demand free of charge to any person appearing to the Board to be interested. Any objection to the confirmation of the Byelaw should be made in writing and addressed to The Fisheries Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, Whitehall Place, London S.W.1, and should be received at that Office before the expiration of the period of deposit of the Byelaw. A copy of the objection should at the same time be sent to the Clerk of the River Board at the address given below.
