The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the British Empire Medal for Gallantry (Military Division) to the undermentioned:

Petty Officer Engineering Mechanic John Taylor, P/KX 690046, H.M.S. Ashanti.

On the 2nd October 1962, a blade failure occurred in H.M.S. ASHANTI'S main propulsion G6 gas turbine whilst running at full power. The resulting damage included fractures of lubricating oil and diesel fuel pipes. Lubricating oil sprayed onto the combustion chambers and caught fire. A large amount of oil and diesel fuel accumulated in the bilge which was in imminent danger of igniting.

Petty Officer Engineering Mechanic Taylor, although not on watch, was an early arrival at the scene of the fire. He took rapid and efficient charge of the fire-fighting operations. Without regard for of the fire-fighting operations. Without regard for his personal safety he attacked the fire himself from the most effective although the most dangerous posithe most effective although the most dangerous posi-tion, namely the bilge beneath the gas turbine. In this position he ran the risk of serious burning had the oil and fuel in the bilge ignited. It was largely due to Petty Officer Engineering Mechanic Taylor's action that the fire was contained and extinguished with a minimum of consequential damage.
