*The Ealing (Rydal Crescent to Wadsworth Road)
Public Path Diversion Order 1963*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 21st day of February 1963 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert part of the public footpath which commences between Nos. 111 and 113, Rydal Crescent and terminates between Nos. 22 and 24, Wadsworth Road. That section of the footpath which runs parallel to the railway together with a small section which runs at right angles to the western end of the first-mentioned section will be extinguished and a new section of footpath running parallel to the railway 32 feet south of the present path together with a small section of footpath running at right angles thereto at the eastern end will be substituted.
