The Hampshire (Romsey and Stockbridge Rural District No. 11) (Parish of King's Somborne, Footpath No. 9) Public Path Diversion Order, 1961.

Notice is hereby given that the above Order, made on the 4th day of December 1961, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way in the Parish of King's Somborne, from the route described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, to the route described in the second column thereof.

SCHEDULE

Existing Route

Commencing at a point in O.S. Parcel No. 280 at the southern corner of Sports Ground O.S. Parcel No. 280b, running in a north-westerly direction through a garden for a distance of 20 yards, thence north-eastwards across Sports Ground to the southern point of Recreation Ground, a distance of 197 yards.

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New Route

Commencing at its junction with the existing path at the southern corner of Sports Ground, running north-eastwards along the southern boundary of Sports Ground to rejoin the existing path at the southern point of Recreation Ground, a distance of 170 yards. (Hants Sheet XXXIX. 12, 1937 Edition.)

Existing Route

From the eastern boundary of Upper Pond at Cranbury Park, running in a north-westerly direction across the Park to the drive of Cranbury House, thence across the drive and along a track to the south-west of the out buildings of the House, to the service road leading to Longmoor Farm, a distance of 650 yards.

New Route

From the eastern boundary of Upper Pond at Cranbury Park, at its junction with the existing path, running in westerly and northerly directions along the boundaries of the copse south of the Park, to the drive of Cranbury House, thence across the drive and in a north-westerly direction along a track to the service road leading to Longmoor Farm, thence northwards along that road to rejoin the existing path, a distance of 850 yards.

CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

Urban District of Trowbridge—Victoria Gardens—Rodwell Park Public Footpath Diversion Order, 1960

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th day of February 1963, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to divert part of the public right of way from Victoria Road towards Springfield Close to a line running from Victoria Road along Victoria Gardens and Rodwell Park to a point at the western corner of Ordnance Parcel 261 (Wilts. Sheet XXXVIII.4-1936 Revision). This diversion will be effective as from the 14th March 1963.

Trussel Bridge—Gormellick—Lodge Hill Road (Unclassified) at Housey, Liskeard
