PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1961

Leigh and Atherton Joint Sewerage Board

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government in exercise of his powers under section 12 (2) of the Public Health (Drainage of Trade Premises) Act 1937, has made an Order entitled the Leigh and Atherton Joint Sewerage Order 1963, which provides that the functions of a local authority under the provisions of sections 2, 7 and 9 of the Public Health (Drainage of Trade Premises) Act 1937, and sections 55, 57, 59, 60, 62, 65 and 70 of the Public Health (Drainage of Trade Premises) Act 1961, shall in relation to the Leigh and Atherton Joint Sewerage District be discharged by the Leigh and Atherton Joint Sewerage Board instead of by the Leigh Borough Council or the Atherton Urban District Council.

The Order also provides that the Leigh Borough Council and the Atherton Urban District Council shall each be an "interested body" for the purposes of the provisions mentioned above in relation to the discharge of trade effluent into any public sewer vested in them and contains certain other incidental and supplementary provisions.

Copies of the Order may be obtained from the Ministry of Housing and Local Government or from the Clerk to the Leigh and Atherton Joint Sewerage Board, Town Hall, Leigh, Lancashire. The Order will become final and come into operation on 15th April 1963, unless within thirty days from the date of publication of this notice, notice of objection to the Order is given to the Minister of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, by some person affected by the Order.

Local Government Commission for Wales
