

BEESTON AND STAPLEFORD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Diversion of Footpath—Deddington Lane to Sandy Lane, Bramcote

NEWMARKET RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Newmarket Rural District (Footpath No. 4 Bottisham) Public Path Diversion Order, 1962

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th day of March 1963, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to divert part of the public right of way running from the Cambridge to Newmarket (A.45) Road to the High Street Bottisham in the County of Cambridge to a line running along the boundary of field O.S. No. 151 approximately 15 yards to the west of the existing public path for a distance of approximately 608 feet and thence in an easterly direction to join up with the existing public footpath so as to secure the efficient use of that land. The part of the existing right of way will be closed on the 28th day of March 1963.

CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

The Rural District Council of Rochford, Hawkwell (No. 1) Public Path Diversion Order, 1962

Notice is hereby given that on the 27th day of February 1963, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the public right of way running from the South-West corner of Field O.S.1366 at the junction with the public footpath running Northwards then running in a generally North-Easterly direction for approximately 366 yards crossing a footbridge over a stream and traversing a wood to its extreme North-Easterly corner where it continues as a public footpath to a line commencing in the North-West corner of The Belchamps Camping and Training Ground for Boy Scouts and running generally in a North-Easterly direction about 10 feet from the Southern side of the ditch along the Northern boundary of the wood for approximately 260 yards until it joins the existing footpath.

The old path will be closed at the expiration of fifty days from the 27th day of February 1963.

Wareham and Purbeck Rural District (Winspit) Public Path Diversion Order, 1962

POOLE BOROUGH COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that the Poole Borough Council intend to apply under the provisions of section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Municipal Buildings, Poole, on Thursday, the 25th April 1963, at 10.30 a.m., for orders authorising the stopping up as unnecessary for the purposes of all traffic of lengths of highways being:

1 (a) that length of Drake Road lying between its junction with Lagland Street and a point 75 feet or thereabouts in a south-easterly direction, and

(b) that length of Lagland Street lying between its junction with Skinner Street and a point 280 feet or thereabouts in a south-westerly direction;

2 (a) that length of Curzon Road lying between its junction with Commercial Road and a point 100 feet in a southerly direction, subject to the reservation of a footpath over the same, and

(b) that length of Curzon Road of a width of 8 feet measured from its western boundary lying between the said point 100 feet south of its junction with Commercial Road and its junction with Wessex Road.

On the hearing of the application any persons who use the lengths of highways and any other person who would be aggrieved by the making of the Orders applied for shall have the right to be heard.
