

*Highways Act 1959**The High Wycombe By-Pass Special Roads (Improvements) Order*

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes, in relation to the above Special Roads which will be situated between Stokenchurch and Beaconsfield in the county of Buckingham, to make under section 13 of the above Act an Order which will:

(a) authorise the Minister:

(i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,

(ii) to stop up highways and to construct new highways, and

(iii) to stop up private means of access to premises and to provide new means of access, all on or in the vicinity of the route of the above Special Roads, and

(b) to provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the highway authority specified therefor in the Order as from the 1st April next after the date on which the Minister notifies that authority that the new highway is open for through traffic.

Any person may within three months from 29th March 1963, object to the making of the Order, by notice to the Minister quoting HR 408/2/05 and stating the grounds of objection.
