

## HAMPSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Hampshire (Winchester Rural District No. 15) (Parish of Owslebury, Footpath No. 14) Public Path Diversion Order 1963*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order, made on the 5th day of March 1963, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way in the Parish of Owslebury, from the route described in first column of the Schedule hereto, to the route described in the second column thereof.

The footpath referred to in the Order is Path No. 14 in the Parish of Owslebury, as shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under the provisions of Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949.

A copy of the Order and the Map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Post Office, Owslebury, during the office hours.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order must be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before the 3rd day of May 1963.

*Existing Route*

That part of the footpath commencing at a point on the Winchester-Morestead Road C.9, approximately 200 yards south-west of Whiteflood Farm, running in a northerly direction across O.S. Parcel No. 107 to a point on the path 350 yards south of the Owslebury-Cheriton Road C.139, a total distance of 375 yards.

*New Route*

Commencing at a point on the Winchester-Morestead Road opposite Whiteflood Farm, running in a north-westerly direction along the eastern boundary of O.S. Parcel No. 107 to join the existing path at a point 350 yards south of the Owslebury-Cheriton Road C.139, a total distance of 315 yards. (Hants Sheet L. 11 and 15, 1909 Edition.)

*The Hampshire (Ringwood and Fordingbridge Rural District No. 3) (Parish of Ellingham, Footpath No. 3) Public Path Diversion Order 1962*

Notice is hereby given that on the 13th day of February 1963, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way in the Parish of Ellingham, from the route described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, to the route described in the second column thereof.

The footpath referred to in the Order is Path No. 3 in the Parish of Ellingham, as shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under the provisions of Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949.

Commencing on a track between fields O.S. Parcels Nos. 115 and 117, at a point approximately 90 yards west of Rockford School, running in a westerly direction along the track, thence in a north-westerly direction across O.S. Parcel No. 117, to a foot bridge over a stream, south-west of Moyles Court Farm a total distance of 367 yards.

*New Route*

Commencing at its junction with the existing path, at a point approximately 90 yards west of Rockford School, running in a northerly direction along, a disused airfield perimeter track for approximately 230 yards to a stream south-west of Moyles Court Farm, thence in a westerly direction along the southern bank of the stream to the existing path, where the stream is crossed by a footbridge, a total distance of 500 yards. ## CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

*Daventry R.D.C. (Hellidon) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1962*

Notice is hereby given that on the 15th day of March 1963, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect will be to extinguish the public right of way running from the south west corner of that part of O.S. 143 abutting on the village street in Hellidon leading in a north easterly direction for approximately 70 yards, thence in an easterly direction for approximately 230 yards to Leam House and thence to its junction with the brideway from the Red Lion Inn to Leam Pool. The existing path will be closed from the 5th April 1963.
