#### DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1951

##### *Suspension of Withdrawal of Authorities*

(ALEXANDER GORDON BONNYMAN)

Whereas Alexander Gordon Bonnyman, M.B., Ch.B., whose registered address is 10 Baird Grove, Murrayfield, Edinburgh 12, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts, 1920 to 1932:

And whereas, the authorities respectively conferred by the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, on the said Alexander Gordon Bonnyman, by virtue of his being a duly qualified medical practitioner, to be in possession of and to supply the drugs and preparations to which these Regulations applied were withdrawn in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 6 of the first mentioned Regulations and Regulation 7 of the last mentioned Regulations by notice published in the *London Gazette* and the *Edinburgh Gazette* on the 28th August 1934:

And whereas by the said notice it was directed that it should not be lawful for the said Alexander Gordon Bonnyman to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928:

And whereas the operation of the said notice was by notice published in the *London Gazette* and *Edinburgh Gazette* on the 12th March 1937, suspended until further Order:

And whereas the operation of the said notice of Suspension was, by notice published in the *London Gazette* and the *Edinburgh Gazette* on the 26th July 1940, cancelled:

And whereas the aforesaid Regulations have been revoked by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, and by virtue of Regulation 38 thereof the aforesaid withdrawal, direction, suspension and cancellation are deemed to have been done and given under the said Regulations of 1953:

And whereas I am satisfied that it is expedient to suspend the said withdrawal of authorities from the said Alexander Gordon Bonnyman:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Regulations 29 and 38 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, I hereby suspend the said withdrawal of authorities from the said Alexander Gordon Bonnyman and I further suspend the operation of the aforesaid direction regarding prescriptions given in respect of the said Alexander Gordon Bonnyman.
