**M**R. Chetwynd, Her Majesty of Great Britain's Envoy Extraordinary, had publick Audience the 6th Instant of our Duke and Ducheſs, and Ducheſs Dowager; and likewise the 8th of the other Princes and Princeſſes of his Royal Highneſs's Family. Our Duke has iſſued new Orders to the Officers in his Service to haſten the raiſing their Recruits, that the ſeveral Regiments may be compleat by the middle of next Month. New Levies are likewise making, particularly in the Montferrate, where 4000 Men are to be raiſed for his Royal Highneſs's Service, who intends early in the Spring to bring into the Field an Army of 20000 effective Men, beſides thoſe that are to garriſon the ſeveral fortified Towns in his Dominion. The Duchy of Milan is to raiſe and maintain 12 Regiments for the King of Spain's Service. Prince Eugene arrived here yeſterday from thence, and intends, after a ſhort ſtay here, to take a Journey to Vienna, to concert Meaſures with that Court for the next Campaign, and then to return to Milan. Our Duke has appointed the Marquis d'Andorin, Son of the Marquis de Parelle, to be Governor of Aſt in the Montferrate. Thirty four Pieces of Cannon have lately been brought hither from Cazal; and ſeveral Barks have been ſent down the Po to Venice and Creſcentino, with proper Engines for the ſhipping up of ſeveral Pieces of Cannon which the French drew into the River when they ſurrendered thoſe Places.

**Milan, Jan. 19.** The Emperor having granted the ſovereignty of this Duchy to the King of Spain, publick Notice has been given of it here; and in few Days our Senate, and the Judges of the ſeveral Tribunals, and other publick Officers, will take the uſual Oaths of Allegiance to his Catholick Majeſty. Four great Barks are arrived here from Pavia, two of them laden with Cannon, Bombs and Granadoes, and the other two with Gunpowder: A further Supply of Artillery and Ammunition is expected from Cazal, and ſoon after that is arrived, the intended Attack of our Caſtle is to be begun. In the mean time the Marquis de Florida, who commands the French and Spaniſh Forces in that Garriſon, has ſent a Meſſage to our Magiſtrates, demanding a further Supply of Proviſions for his Men, and threatening, in caſe of refusal, to fire upon the Town: Whereupon they have conferred with the Marquis de Prie, the Emperor's Commiſſioner here, and with the Count de Coningſeck, who commands the Blockade of the Caſtle; and have ſent an Expreſs to Prince Eugene at Turin to receive his Directions in this Affair.

**Waſaw, Jan. 15.** Part of thoſe Forces of the Crown which have declared for King Stanilaus came lately to Lowitz, from whence they have ſent a Detachment hither; and the Officer who commands it requires 5000 Crowns of this City by way of Contribution, and a proportionable Sum of the adjacent Country. The Saxon Commiſſaries who were at Pultauſk, and in ſome other neighbouring Towns, raiſing Contributions, are retired to Thorn. Several Regiments of the Saxon Troops are marched for Saxony, and the reſt are forthwith to follow. They write from Cracow, That the Archbiſhop of Gneſnen, as Primate of Poland, has iſſued Circular Letters, inviting the Nobility to a great Council, to be held at Lemberg the 7th of next Month, to conſult upon the Meaſures to be taken in the preſent Conjunction; and that he was gone thither; as were alſo the Great Maſhal, and ſeveral other Officers of the Crown, that had lately been at Zolkiow to confer with Prince Menzikoff, General of the Muſcovite Forces; from whom they had received Affurances, That the Czar would ſhortly come in Perſon with a numerous Army to ſupport them againſt King Stanilaus, and thoſe in his Intereſt.

**Vienna, Jan. 19.** The raiſing of Recruits for the Emperor's Forces is continued in the Hereditary Countries with very good Succes. Letters from Upper Hungary ſay, the Malecontents are making new Levies; and that General Rabutin, ſince his Departure from Debrezin, had continued his March without any Oppoſition from the Malecontents, and intended to be at Buda the 20th Inſtant, in order to furniſh that Place with all Neceſſaries for its Defence, and afterwards to reinforce the Garriſons of Gran, Comorra, and Raab.

**Berlin, Jan. 22.** The 19th Inſtant the King of Prussia held a Chapter of the Order of the Black Eagle, into which his Majeſty admitted the Margrave of Brandenburg-Bareith, the Prince of Hohenzollern, the Count of Lottum, and the Count of Denhoff; and the two former being abſent, did by their Proxies receive the Collar of the Order, as the other two did in Perſon: Which Ceremony was performed in the Royal Chapel; and his Majeſty afterwards gave a ſplendid Entertainment to the Knights of the Order who were there preſent, and to ſeveral other Perſons of Quality. Monſieur Printz, who was lately ſent from this Court to the King of Sweden, and ſince came hither to give his Prussian Majeſty an Account of his Negotiations, is going back to Saxony with further Inſtructions. Baron Knipphaufen being appointed to go in the Quality of his Majeſty's Ambaſſador to the Catholick King Charles III. is preparing for his Journey to Spain.

**Hamburg, Jan. 25.** Letters from Dantzick ſay, The Magiſtrates of that City, upon Advice of the Peace lately concluded in the North, have acknowledged King Stanilaus, and reſolved to ſend Deputies to Saxony to compliment him on his Acceſſion to the Throne.

**Francfort, Jan. 26.** Our Advices from the Rhine ſay, the Troops on both ſides continue very quiet in their Winter Quarters. The Margrave of Bareith had been viewing the Imperial Lines near Stolhoffen, and giving the neceſſary Orders for their being put into the beſt Poſture of Defence poſſible; and was gone towards Buhl, in order to take a View likewise of the Lines near that Place. The new Levies in theſe Parts and in Bavaria, for recruiting and augmenting the Forces of the Emperor, and thoſe of the ſeveral Circles, go on very ſucceſſfully. The Daniſh Troops which ſerved the laſt Campaign in Hungary are to come into Bavaria, to be there recruited, and to remount their Horſe. Cardinal Lamberg, the Emperor's chief Plenipotentiary at the Diet at Ratiſbon, is dangerously ill.

**Hague, Feb. 1. N. S.** Mr. Stepney, Her Majeſty of Great Britain's Envoy Extraordinary, ſet out from hence the 30th paſt for the Court of the Langrave of Heſſe Caſſel. Deputies are come hither from the Town of Tournay, to treat about the Contributions demanded of that Place, and its Dependencies. They writes from Duſſeldorp, That the Elektor Palatine intended ſhortly to go from thence to Heilbron, to meet the Elektor of Mentz; and after having conferred with him, to proceed to Vienna.
