In the mean time the Marquis de Florida, who commands the French and Spaish Forces in that Garison, has sent a Message to our Magistrares, demanding a further Supply of Provisions for his Men, and threatening, in case of restal, to fire upon the Town: Whereupon they have conserted with the Marquis de Prie, the Emperor's Commissioner here, and with the Count de Coningset, who commands the Blockade of the Castle; and have sent an Express to Prince Eugene at Turing the Pries his Diractions in this Affair

wifaw, Jan. 15. Part of those Forces of the Crown which have declared for King Stanislaus came lately be Lowiz, from whence they have sent a Detachment lither; and the Officer who commands it requires 5000 Crowns of this City by way of Contribution, and a proportionable Sum of the adjacent Country. The Saxon Commissaries who were at Pultausk, and in some other neighbouring Towns, raising Contributions, are retired to Thorn. Several Regiments of the Saxon Troops are marched for Saxony, and the rest are forthwith to follow. They write from Cracow, That the Archbishop of Griesinen, as Primate of Poland, has issued Circular Letters, inviting the Nobility to a great Council, to be held at Lemberg the 7th of next Month; to consult upon the Measures to be taken in the present Conjuncture; and that he was gone thither; as were also the Great Marshal, and several other Officers of the Crown, that had lately been at Zolkiow to confer with Prince Menzikoff, General of the Muscovite Forces; from whom they had received Assurances, That the Czar would shortly come in Person with a numerous Army to support them against King Stanislaus, and those in his Interest.

Piema, Jan 19. The raifing of Recruits for the Emperor's Forces is continued in the Hereditary Countries with very good Success. Letters from Upper Hungary fay, the Malecontents are making new Levies; and that General Rabutin, fince his Departure from Debrezin, had continued his March without any Opposition from the Malecontents, and intended to be at Buda the 20th Instant, in order to surnish that Place with all Necessaries for its Desence, and afterwards to reinforce the Garisons of Gran, Comorra, and Raab.

Berlin, Jan. 22. The 19th Instant the King of Prussia held a Chapter of the Order of the Black Eagle, into which his Majesty admitted the Margrave of Brandenbourg-Bareith, the Prince of Hohenzollern, the Count of Lottum, and the Count of Denhoss; and the two former being absent, did by their Proxies receive the Collar of the Order, as the other two did in Person: Which Ceremony was personned in the Royal Chapel; and his Majesty afterwards gave a splendid Entertainment to the Knights of the Order who were there present, and to several other Persons of Quality. Monsieur Printz, who was lately sent from this Court to the King of Sweden, and since came hither to give his Prussian Majesty an Account of his Negociations, is going back to Saxony with further Instructions. Baron Kniphausen being appointed to go in the Quality of his Majesty's Ambassador to the Catholick King Charles III. is preparing for his Journey to Spain.

Francfort, Jan. 26. Our Advices from the Rhine fay, the Troops on both fides continue very quiet in their Winter Quarters. The Margrave of Bareith had been viewing the Imperial Lines near Stolhoffen, and giving the necessary Orders for their being put into the best Posture of Desence possible; and was gone towards Buhl, in order to take a View likewise of the Lines near that Place. The new Levies in these Parts and in Bavaria, for recruiting and augmenting the Forces of the Emperor, and those of the several Circles, go on very successfully. The Danish Troops which served the last Campaign in Hungary are to come into Bavaria, to be there recruited, and to remount their Horse. Cardinal Lamberg, the Emperor's chief Plenipotentiary at the Diet at Ratisbon, is dangerously ill.
