Lisbon, Jan. 19. N. S.

**T**HE Fleet of Men of War and Transport Ships commanded by Sir Cloudesly Shovell, with the Land Forces on Board under the Command of the Earl Rivers, set sail from hence yesterday about 3 in the afternoon for Valparaiso, where according to our last Advices, the Troops under the Command of the Earl of Galway are in a very good Condition. The Portuguese are likewise making the necessary Preparations for the carrying on the War on this side. The Tamar Frigate arrived here last night from Portsmouth, and will sail in 2 day or two for Valentia.

**Turin, Jan. 19.** The 17th Instant a great Council of War was held here, wherein the Duke of Savoy, Prince Eugene, the Prince of Hesse Cassel, and several other General Officers were present; and his Royal Highness and Prince Eugene are frequently in Conference together, to concert Measures frequently in the next Campaign. The raising of Recruits is considered in these Parts with all imaginable Care and Application, as are likewise the Preparations for a Siege; but it is yet uncertain whether his Royal Highness will begin with that of Susa or of Final. We have an Account, That the Privateers of Oneglia have lately taken a French Prize, bound from Marseilles to Genoa, with Goods and a considerable Sum of Money.

**Milan, Jan. 25.** The Prince d'Elbeuf is returned hither from Vienna. Every thing is now in readiness for the attacking of our Castle, and Prince Eugene is shortly expected from Turin to give his last Orders about the carrying on of the Service; after which he intends to take a Journey to Visconti. The Abbot Riviera, who is sent by the Pope to solicit his Highness the Contributions to be paid by the Ferrarini and other Territories of the Ecclesiastical State, contrary to his Return from Turin. The Imperialists here, expecting his Return from Turin, are making the necessary Dispositions for the more close blocking up of that Place.

**Warsaw, Jan. 25.** Letters from Lemberg give an Account, That the Archbishop of Gnesen, the Crown-General, and several others of the chief Nobility of Poland, who are in the same Interest, were gone from thence to Zolkiew, where the Czar of Muscovy is said to be arrived, to confer with him upon the Measures to be taken in the present Conjunction. Their intended Meeting at Lemberg continues fixed for the 7th of next Month.

**Vienna, Jan. 26.** The Emperor has appointed the Prince and Cardinal of Saxe-Zitz to succeed the late Cardinal Colloitz in the Dignities of Archbishop of Gran, and Primate of all Hungary. Our Letters from thence give an Account, That General Staremberg having held a Council of War at Presbourg, and reviewed the Forces under his Command which were Quartered about that Place, was marched with them towards Buda; where, by our last Advices, General Rabutin was arrived with the Body of Troops he commands, which is about 12000 strong. The Malecontents in the mean time continue to make Excursions, and have lately plundered and burnt several Villages on the Frontiers of Stiria, within 6 leagues of Gratz.

**Leipsick, Jan. 29.** King Augustus went from hence yesterday morning to meet the Electress Dowager his Mother, and the Electoral Prince his Son, who lately arrived from Holstein, and are expected here in a day or two. The Queen will also return hither in a few days from Culmbach. The King of Sweden continues at Alt-Ranstad. The new Levies for his Majesty's Service are carried on with great Diligence.

**Frankfort, Feb. 2.** The Deputies of the Circle of the Upper Rhine continue assembled in this Place, and have lately come to several Resolutions for the speedy providing of their Quota of Troops and Artillery, for carrying on the War the next Campaign; when, as is said, we shall have a more numerous Army upon the Rhine than we had the last. The French on their side are making great Preparations in Alsace, and give out, That the Duke of Bavaria is to command their Army in those Parts the next Summer.

**Hammer, Feb. 4.** The Electoral Prince and the young Prince are both in very good Health. He was Christened by the Name of Frederick Lewis; the King of Prussia and the Elector being Godfathers; and the Electress Dowager Godmother.

**Calogne, Feb. 4.** The Deputies of the States of this Electorate have lately come to an Agreement with the King of Prussia's Commissaries, concerning the Forage and other Necessaries with which they are to supply his Majesty's Forces which are quartered in these Parts. Our Magistrates have given Directions to the Officers who commands their Quota of Troops, to have them in a readiness early in the Spring in order to which Recruits are raising with all possible Expedition; but they are forbid to lift any French Deserters. They write from Dusseldorp. That General Doff came thither last by from Holland; and after having conferred with the Elector Palatine, continued his Journey the 21st past towards Vienna.

**Hague, Febr. 8. N.S.** The States of Holland and West-Friseland will meet to morrow, to go through several Matters relating to the Government of this Province, which were left unfinished when they last Adjourned. Monsieur d'Auverquerque is expected here this week from Brussels. Count Rechteren is preparing for his Departure for Germany, being appointed by the States to negotiate some Matters at the Court of Vienna, and with several Princes of the Empire. The Ambassadors from the Republick of Venice continue at Rotterdam, where they expect very suddenly part of their Equipage, which had been left behind; and as soon as that is arrived, they intend to Embark for England. The raising of Recruits for our Forces is carried on with all possible Diligence and Application, the Officers being ordered to have their Regiments complete by the 25th of the next Month. They write from Mastricht, That a great Convoy was arrived there from Dusseldorp, with Recruits and Cloathing for the Palatine Troops which are quartered in those Parts.

**Falmouth, Jan. 27.** Yesterday sailed hence the Sarah Dogger, bound from Cadiz to London, laden with Fruit, Francis Arbalaiz Commander: At the same time came in the Griffin Privateer of Middleburgh from cruising, Jacob Haggis Commander, and brought in with her as Prize the Three Brothers of Nantz from Martinico, laden with Sugar and Indigo. James Cotter Matter. This Day arrived here the Sufannali Galley of Plimouth from Oporto, bound for London, laden with Wine, Daniel Gittro Matter.

**Plimouth, Jan. 28.** Yesterday arrived here the James Galley from Lisbon, and the Dutchess Galley from Viana.

**Dartmouth, Jan. 28.** Yesterday came in here the Sarah Dogger, bound for London, and laden with Fruit from Cadiz. This Day came in the Martin Privateer of Guernsey from cruising, having taken two Prizes, one of which he sent to Weymouth, and the other to Guernsey. Here is also sent in by Capt. Van Elst, Commander of the Stadt Van Zeland, a Privateer of Middleburgh, a French Merchant-ship of 26 Guns, belonging to Bourdeaux, homeward bound from Martinico, and richly laden with Sugar, Indigo, and Coco.

**Portsmouth, Jan. 30.** On the 27th Instant was put back to Spithead by contrary Winds Admiral Vandergoes, with nine Dutch Men of War, and about forty Sail of Merchant-men under their Convoy, bound for Lisbon.

**Deal, Jan. 31.** Yesterday came to the Downes the Admiralty Galley from Leghorne, the Norton Galley from Zant; and this Day the Phenix Galley from Leghorne, and the Cornwell Galley from Zant.

**St. James's, Jan. 30.** On the 21st Instant Monsieur Kirchner, Resident of the King of Poland and Elector of Saxony, had a Private Audience of Her Majesty, wherein he delivered a Letter from the King his Master concerning the Treaty of Peace lately concluded between him and the King of Sweden: To which Audience he was conducted by Charles Cottrell Esq; Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.
