LEATHERHEAD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Leatherhead Parking Places Order, 1963

Notice is hereby given that on the 24th June 1963, the Urban District Council of Leatherhead made an Order under sub-section (2) of section 11 of, and sub-section (1) of section 16 of the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960, the effect of which is to control the off-street parking places of the Council in the town of Leatherhead mentioned in Lists "A", "B" and "C" below, on and after 29th July 1963, as follows:

1. To limit the period for which vehicles may wait, as follows:

List "A"—Between 9.15 a.m. and 6 p.m. on week-days only. 2 hours.

List "B"—At all times. 24 hours.

List "C"—Between 9.15 a.m. and 6 p.m. on week-days other than Saturday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday. 2 hours.

All other times. 24 hours.

2. To limit the classes of vehicles for which the parking places in Lists "A" and "B" are available to motor cars (other than goods vehicles having a greater overall length than 16 feet and a greater overall width than 6 feet), motor cycles and invalid carriages.

3. To limit the class of vehicle for which the parking place mentioned in List "C" is available to goods vehicles only (except on a Saturday, Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday).

4. To authorise and provide for the collection of the following charges for vehicles left in the parking places mentioned in List "B":

Motor cycles without side-cars, if left within the space reserved for them. 6d. per day or part of a day.

Other vehicles. 1s. per day or part of a day.

5. To prescribe the positions in which vehicles may wait in the parking places, to require engines to be stopped, to prohibit the sounding of horns, the parking of unlicensed vehicles and the carrying on of business from vehicles and the carrying out of work of construction on the vehicles, to require drivers to follow any specified route of entry or departure, to authorise the removal of vehicles in case of emergency or of contravention of the Order, and to enable disabled drivers to seek exemption from charges for parking.

6. To authorise the Council to remove and ultimately to sell or otherwise dispose of any vehicle abandoned on a parking place, and to recover any costs from the last owner of the vehicle or other responsible person, and to provide for the disposal of any sum received by the Council from the sale of such a vehicle.
