*Highways Act, 1959**The Preston By-Pass Motorway Connecting Roads (Appropriation No. 2) Order, 1963*

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 13 of the above Act, for appropriating as parts of the special roads authorised by the Preston By-Pass Motorway Connecting Roads (No. 2) Special Roads Scheme, 1963, parts of the existing roads which connect the Preston By-Pass Motorway with Church Road (A.6) at Bamber Bridge in the County of Lancaster.
