And for the better énabling you to carry out the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents authorise you to call in the aid and cooperation of owners of ancient monuments, inviting them to assist you in furthering the objects of the Commission; and to invite the possessors of such papers as you may deem it desirable to inspect to papers as you have them before you. produce them before you:

And We do further authorise and empower confer with the Council of The National Buildings Record from time to time as may seem expedient to you in order that your deliberations may be assisted by the reports and records in the possession of the Council: and to make such arrangements for the furtherance of objectives of common interest to yourselves and the Council as may be mutually agreeable:
