The QUEEN has been graciously pleased, on the advice of Her Majesty's Canadian Ministers, to give orders for the undermentioned award of the British Empire Medal.

*Awarded the British Empire Medal for Gallantry
(Civil Division)*

Miss Barbara Ann PIESINGER, Uranium City,
Saskatchewan.

Miss Piesinger was acting as a baby sitter to two children, one age 22 months and the other age 9 months. The family occupied a two-room shack, with a built on porch. Light was supplied by a gas lantern suspended from a hook on an open rafter in the kitchen-living room. Miss Piesinger was reading in the kitchen when she suddenly noticed that the top portion of the lantern was in flames, and the rafter beginning to burn. She attempted to put out the fire by throwing water on it. When this failed she obtained a piece of wood from the porch and lifted the lantern off the nail. However, the lantern was too heavy and it crashed to the floor exploding, and spraying Miss Piesinger and parts of the floor with the flaming gas. Miss Piesinger hurriedly rushed past the spreading fire on the floor of the shack to the other room where the children were sleeping. She untied one from a hammock and picked up the other from the bed, carrying them past the fire to the porch. She then put on her coat, took a child under each arm and ran to her home, fifty yards up the street. The doctor was called and she was treated for second and third degree burns to the face, extensive second degree burns to both arms, extending from the fingers to shoulders, and minor first degree burns to neck and chest.
