#### CORNWALL RIVER BOARD

##### *New Fishery Byelaws*

Notice is hereby given that the Cornwall River Board intend to apply at the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice for the confirmation by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, of Byelaws made by the Board for securing the efficient discharge of their functions.

The proposed Byelaws, which relate to the Camel and Fowey Fishery Districts only, alter:

- the annual close season for salmon (rod and line) to be the period between the 15th December and the 1st April following, and
- the annual close season for migratory trout (rod and line) to be the period between the 30th September and the 1st April following.
