

- (2) Along the said Embankment commencing at the south-west corner of Enclosure No. 4928 on Ordnance Sheet No. Carmarthenshire LV. III. 12, 1916 Edition and proceeding in an easterly direction terminating in the south-eastern corner of Enclosure No. 4927 on Ordnance Sheet No. Carmarthenshire LV. III. 12, 1916 Edition.
- (3) Commencing approximately 100 feet from the north-eastern boundary of Enclosure No. 4933 on Ordnance Sheet No. Carmarthenshire LV. III. 12, 1916 Edition and proceeding in a north-easterly direction through Enclosures No. 4925, 4924 and 4889 on Ordnance Sheet No. Carmarthenshire LV. III. 12, 1916 Edition, terminating at a point on the north-eastern corner of the said Enclosure No. 4889.

The work will consist of:

In respect of the section of the proposed work described in paragraph (1) above:

- (a) Reinforced concrete cast in situ flood wall commencing at the western end of the Machynis end of the scheme for a distance of approximately 700 feet to the southernmost extension of the existing Marsh Embankment as described in (1) above.
- (b) A concrete piled parapet to the existing flood bank from the said southernmost point of the said Embankment to its termination at the point west of Parc Eionon Farm described in paragraph (1) above, plus some new pitching of the seaward face of the flood banks, the repair and strengthening of the existing pitching and some strengthening of the banks themselves.

In respect of the section of the proposed work described in paragraph (2) above:

The widening and heightening of the existing flood banks from its point of commencement to its point of termination, as described above, including extensions at each end, followed by the construction of a new piled parapet similar to that described in relation to paragraph (1) above.

In respect of the section of the proposed work described in paragraph (3) above:

The construction of an entirely new flood bank, complete with drainage channel and pipe culverts, from the point of commencement to the point of termination, as described in paragraph (3) above. The estimated cost of the work is £108,000.

Any person may, not later than the 15th February 1964, serve a written Notice of Objection to the above proposals on the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and on the above-mentioned Authority. Any such notice must contain a statement of the grounds of objection and must be sent by prepaid post to the Welsh Secretary, Welsh Office and Office for Wales of the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Cathays Park, Cardiff, and to the Clerk of the Authority at the address shown below.

The County of Devon (Atlantic Way and Nelson Road, Westward Ho!) (One-Way and Restriction on Waiting) Order, 1964.

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be:

(i) to impose one-way traffic from west to east in Nelson Road, Westward Ho!, between its western and eastern junctions with Atlantic Way;

Imposition of 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit Ipswich-Foxhall Road (Revised Extended Length)
