The Wilmslow Urban District Council (No Waiting) (Church Street) (Unilateral Waiting) (Water Lane) Order, 1964.

Notice is hereby given that the Wilmslow Urban District Council propose to make an Order under powers contained in the Road Traffic Act, 1960, enabling them in that behalf the effect of which shall be to prohibit waiting of vehicles on the roads referred to in the schedules 1 and 2.

1. Save as provided in Article 3 of the Order no person shall except upon the direction or permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in the schedules.

- (c) to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in connection with any building opera-tion or demolition, the removal of any obstruc-tion to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or re-construction of any of the lengths of road or re-construction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, crection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of road of any sewer, or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or elec-tricity or of any telegraph line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878. (d) to enable the vehicles to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any grazge situated on or
- (a) to chaot into vehicles to take in petrol, on, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to any of the said lengths of road, or
 (e) in the case of any vehicle owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise
- (f) for the purpose of loading or unloading the vehicle while the vehicle is in actual use in con-nection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository
- (g) if the vehicle is a fire engine or ambulance or any vehicle in the service of a local authority or police force in either case being used in pur-
- suance of statutory powers or duties. (h) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circum-stances beyond his control or to such waiting
- being necessary to prevent an accident.
 (i) if the vehicle is in the service of or employed by the Postmaster General and waiting in any affected length of road while postal packets addressed to any address in that length of road are being unloaded from the vehicle of having been unloaded are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to that length of road or is in use in connection with the cleaning of telephone kiosks adjacent to that length of road.

4. The Interpretation Act, 1889, is to apply for the interpretation of the Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
