

UNITED KINGDOM OIL PIPELINES LIMITED

PUBLIC INQUIRY

Pipe-lines Act 1962

Notice is hereby given that, whereas United Kingdom Oil Pipelines Limited have applied to the Minister of Power for authorisation under section 1 (1) of the Pipe-lines Act 1962 of the construction of a cross-country pipe-line to convey light petroleum products between the Thames Estuary, Stanwell in the County of Middlesex, the Midlands, and the Mersey, and objections have been made to the proposals, the Minister has directed that a public inquiry be held.

The inquiry will be held at the Lecture Hall, Public Library, Hempstead Road, Watford, Herts, on Tuesday, 14th April 1964, at 10 a.m., at the Council Chamber, 24 Warwick Street, Rugby, Warwickshire, on Tuesday, 28th April 1964, at 10 a.m., and at the Guildhall, Lichfield, Staffordshire, on Tuesday, 12th May 1964, at 10 a.m. Mr. A. K. Pollock, M.I.C.E., M.I.W.E., and Mr. A. R. Chown, M.A., M.T.P.I., Dip.T.P., of the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, have been appointed by the Minister as Inspectors to hold the inquiry, and will be prepared to receive the evidence of any persons with an interest in the matter.

United Kingdom Oil Pipelines Limited have requested the Minister, if he authorises the construction of the proposed works, to authorise it along a route modified in certain parts. Opportunity for objection to departures from the route delineated on the map which accompanied the application will be afforded at the public inquiry.

A copy of the Company's application, together with the supporting documents (including maps and plans) intended to be put in evidence at the inquiry may be inspected at the Ministry of Power, Thames House South, Millbank, London S.W.1, or at the project office of the Company at Porchester Gardens, Bayswater, London W.2, or at the offices of Messrs. Chesshire and Gibson, 21 Waterloo Street, Birmingham 2.

A copy of the maps showing that part of the route of the proposed pipeline (including the modifications where requested) which runs through the area of each county council, county borough council, borough council and district council affected can also be inspected at the offices of the council, as set out in the Schedule below.

NAVIGATION BYELAWS

Notice is hereby given that the Nene River Board intend to apply at the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this Notice for the confirmation by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food of an additional Byelaw made by the Board for regulating the navigation of such part of the River Nene as is subject to the provisions of the three first above mentioned Acts or any of them, that is from Northampton to Bevis Hall near Wisbech.

The proposed Byelaw provides that:

No person shall (subject to certain exceptions) navigate a mechanically propelled vessel, or engage in the sport of water ski-ing, aquaplaning or the like, on that part of the River upstream of Dog-in-a-Doublet Lock.

During a period of one calendar month from the date of publication of this Notice a printed copy of the said Byelaw will be deposited at the Offices of the Board at the address mentioned below, and will be open to public inspection without charge on any weekday during the usual office hours. During the same period printed copies of the Byelaw will also be supplied on demand and free of charge to any person appearing to the Board to be interested.

Any objection to the confirmation of the Byelaw should be made in writing and addressed to:
