The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 3) Order 1964.

This Order:

(i) provides for the allowance of drawback of import duty on the exportation of all imported goods classified in Tariff heading 40.11 suitable for cycles not mechanically propelled:

(ii) amends the present provision of drawback of import duty on imported boxes of softwood box-boards to include all boxes within stated dimensions imported complete but unassembled, with drawbacks to be allowable only on the exportation in the boxes of all fish other than shellfish:

(iii) provides for the allowance of drawback of import duty on:

(a) imported bones, whether crushed or uncrushed, used in the manufacture of glue or gelatine or certain other bone products for export; and

(b) certain imported wooden golf club head blocks used in the manufacture of golf clubs for export:

(iv) amends the present provision of drawback of import duty on certain imported hatters' fur used in the manufacture of hats, bonnets and other specified headgear for export:

(v) increases the rates of drawback of import duty on imported fresh bitter oranges used in the manufacture of orange marmalade and prepared oranges for export: and

(vi) revokes the present provision of drawback of import duty on specified imported wood and timber used in the manufacture of sewing machine stand legs for export, and varies the rates of drawback of import duty on certain imported wood and timber and wooden veneer sheets used in the manufacture of specified exported sewing machine woodwork.

The Order comes into operation on the 6th May 1964, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1964, No. 629.

The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 5) Order 1964.

The First Schedule to the Order provides for the exemption from import duty from 6th May 1964, until 1st January 1965 (except where some other date is shown) of certain goods (mainly chemicals) at present liable to import duty.

The Second Schedule to the Order provides for the extension until 1st January 1965 (except where some other date is shown) of existing temporary exemptions from import duty of certain goods (mainly chemicals). These exemptions would otherwise have expired on 6th May 1964.

The Order comes into operation on the 6th May 1964, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1964, No. 628.
