Wages Council (England and Wales)

The Retail Food Trades Wages Council (England and Wales) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Retail Food) (England and Wales) Order 1962 (Order R.F.C. (37)) as amended by the Wages Regulation (Retail Food) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Order 1963 (Order R.F.C. (39)) and requiring holidays to be allowed and holiday remuneration to be paid in accordance with that Order and (2) the revocation of Order R.F.C. (37) and Order R.F.C. (39).

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within 14 days from 19th May 1964.
