The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 5) Order 1964.

This Order extends until 31st July 1965 the provision of drawback of import duty on imported creped paper used in the manufacture of exported adhesive tape.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958 viz:

The Import Duties (General) (No. 7) Order, 1964.

This Order reduces the United Kingdom import duty by 60 per cent., with effect from 1st July 1964, on the following products when they are consigned from a place in the E.F.T.A. area and satisfy the E.F.T.A. origin rules:

ex 05-04 Edible guts, bladders and stomachs, whole and pieces thereof, of bovine animals, other than sausage casings.

ex 08-09 Melons.

ex 12-03 Seeds of coniferous species.

These duty reductions are the result of a recent agreement in E.F.T.A. to transfer several products from Annex D (the list of agricultural items which fall outside the scope of the E.F.T.A. duty reductions) into the industrial sector, where they will be subject to duty reductions in accordance with the E.F.T.A. duty reduction timetable under which E.F.T.A. duties will be eliminated on 31st December 1966.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st July 1964, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1964, No. 909.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 3 (6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958, viz.:

The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 6) Order 1964.

The First Schedule to the Order provides for the exemption from import duty from 1st July 1964 until 1st January 1965 (except where some other date is shown) of certain goods (mainly chemicals) at present liable to import duty.

The Second Schedule to the Order provides for the extension until 1st January, 1965 (except where some other date is shown) of existing temporary exemptions from import duty of certain goods (mainly chemicals). These exemptions would otherwise have expired on 1st July 1964.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st July 1964 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1964 No. 910.
