

MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, FISHERIES AND FOOD

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS 1937 AND 1948

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that he hereby recognises the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto, as showing (a) that the meat to which the Certificate relates or the meat from which the meat product to which the Certificate relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing of the meat or meat product.

The Certificates hereby recognised are in substitution for the Certificates numbered (1), (3) and (4) in the Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of 11th March, 1952 which are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

Argentine Republic

(1) For meat and meat products contained in wrappers, boxes, or barrels, a stamp or impression or brand of the following design:



The Certificate will be completed by the insertion of the number of the Establishment. In relation to meat products contained in tins, the recognition is restricted to those certificates which are completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers: 1, 1A, 2, 6, 7, 8, 9, 12, 15, 16, 44, 66 or 164.

(2) For barrels containing edible fats, an inscription of the following design in paint stencilled on wood:
