TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1962

Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

Border Rural District Council (The Old Vicarage, Crosby-on-Eden) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1964

Notice is hereby given that G. W. Maycock, Esq., V.R.D., B.Sc.(Econ), M.C.D., A.M.T.P.I. will hold a local inquiry at the Parish Hall, Crosby-on-Eden on Thursday 30th July 1964, at 10.30 a.m. for the purpose of hearing objections to the Minister's proposal to make an Order under section 112 (5) of the Highways Act 1959.

The effect of the Order, if made by the Minister, would be to extinguish the public right of way leading from the Newby East Road to the Carlisle-Brampton Road, Crosby-on-Eden, which starts at a point between the properties known as the Old Vicarage and Holme Farm on the Newby East Road 63 yards south of its junction with the Carlisle-Brampton road and runs first north-east and then north north-east at the rear of the Old Vicarage for a distance of 73 yards to a point on the Carlisle-Brampton Road.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

Public Paths Extinguishment Order 1964

Notice is hereby given that on 24th June 1964 the Minister of Housing and Local Government in pursuance of his powers under subsection (5) of section 112 of the Highways Act 1959, made the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish as from 22nd July 1964, the public right of way over a footpath at Rushden in the County of Northampton

commencing at Wymington Road at a point on the north-western corner of the Rushden South End Primary School grounds marked "A" on the map and runs diagonally across the said school grounds to a point on the south-eastern corner thereof marked "B" on the map and extends south-east along the rear boundary fence of Nos. 19, 19A, 21 and 23 Harvey Road then south-west between houses Nos. 23 and 25 Harvey Road to a point on that road marked "C" on the map being a total distance of approximately 494 yards.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order made by the Minister has been deposited at the offices of the Rushden Urban District Council, Council Buildings, Rushden, and at the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, and may be inspected during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 10th July 1964, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

Luxulyan, Cornwall
