### RIVER BOARDS ACT 1948

#### *Isle of Wight River Board*

In pursuance of sub-section (3) of section 6 of the River Boards Act 1948, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food hereby gives notice that the Isle of Wight River Board have made application under the said sub-section that the map approved under sub-section (2) of the said section, showing the extent of the main river for the purpose of Part II of the Land Drainage Act 1930, be varied by the addition to the said main river of:—

1. Part of the River Medina at Cowes.
2. Part of an un-named watercourse from a point near Lucketts, Carnmore to its confluence with Thorley Brook near Thorley.
3. A short length of channel across the A.3054 road near Endfield, Shalfleet.
4. Part of the River Yar at Bembridge.
5. A length of channel together with a short length of tributary channel at Tapnell Furze, Wilmington.
6. Part of Brook Stream, from Sud Moor Withy Bed to its outfall in Brook Chine.
7. A watercourse from Buddhole Spring to its outfall through Grange Chine, Brighstone.
8. A watercourse from Little Atherfield Farm to its outfall through Shepherd's Chine, together with part of a tributary watercourse from a point near Brook Cottages.

And by deletion from the said main river of:—

9. A short length of watercourse near Tapnell Furze, Wilmington.

Plans, bearing the reference IW.2 on which the additions and deletion are shown by lines in green colour and purple colour respectively, together with a copy of the statutory map showing existing main river, have been deposited at the offices of the Isle of Wight River Board, County Hall, Newport, Isle of Wight, and at the offices of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food (Room 410), Great Westminster House, Horseferry Road, London S.W.1, for public inspection within the period ending with 25th August 1964 and may be inspected during normal office hours.

Any objection to the proposed variation of the statutory map should be made in writing and sent by post, addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, at the address mentioned below, within the period mentioned above, quoting reference LDC 710.

### LAND DRAINAGE ACT 1930

#### RIVER BOARDS ACT 1948

##### *East Suffolk and Norfolk River Board* *Felixstowe Internal Drainage Board*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 4 (3) and 14 of the Land Drainage Act 1930, as applied by the River Boards Act 1948, has now made an Order confirming a scheme submitted to him by the East Suffolk and Norfolk River Board, under section 4 (1) (b) of the Land Drainage Act 1930, making provision for the reconstitution of the Felixstowe Internal Drainage Board.

The Order will become final, and have effect as an Act of Parliament, unless, within the period of deposit mentioned below, a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial, praying that the Order shall be subject to special parliamentary procedure.

## DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES FOR SCOTLAND

### *Diseases of Animals Act, 1950*

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, have made the following Order:

#### *Statutory Instruments 1964 No. 1055*

##### *The Markets (Protection of Animals) Order, 1964* *(Made 8th July 1964)*

This order, which is made under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, provides for the protection of cattle, sheep, goats and pigs from unnecessary suffering while exposed for sale in markets or awaiting removal afterwards. Unfit animals (including animals which are overstocked or which need food or water) may be treated and if necessary removed for the purpose by a veterinary inspector at the expense of the owner. Animals must be watered as often as necessary; they must be fed and watered if they are awaiting removal overnight, and afterwards every 12 hours until they are removed. Provision is made for the penning of animals, including the tying of bulls and the segregation of horned and hornless cattle. Calves, dairy cows in milk and pigs must be kept under cover of a roof where such accommodation is available. Market authorities are obliged to provide a supply of drinking water, facilities for drinking, and pens which are free from injurious projections.

The order comes into operation on 16th July 1964, but the provisions relating to feeding, watering and the obligations of market authorities will not be operative until 6 months later. The segregation of horned cattle becomes obligatory on 16th January 1966.

## DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS, 1877-1927

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made the following Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877-1927.

#### *The Seed Potatoes (Redskin Variety) Order, 1964.*

This Order prohibits the sale and delivery and the bringing into England and Wales of uncertified seed potatoes of the Redskin variety except under licence. It also requires a seller of uncertified seed potatoes of the Redskin variety to label or mark the containers with the number of any such licence or in the case of certain grades of certified Redskin seed potatoes from Scotland, with the number of an official declaration that the potatoes have been inspected for freedom from Redskin abnormality.
