## MID-SUSSEX WATER ORDER 1964

Notice is hereby given that the Mid-Sussex Water Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") are applying to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for an Order under section 23 of the Water Act 1945.

## CITY OF BIRMINGHAM

*The City of Birmingham Smoke Control (Nos. 94, 114, 115, 116 and 117) Orders, 1964*

Notice is hereby given that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Birmingham, acting by the Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 10th day of July 1964, made Orders entitled "The City of Birmingham Smoke Control (Nos. 94, 114, 115, 116 and 117) Orders, 1964", declaring the areas described in the Schedules hereto to be smoke control areas, which Orders are about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Orders and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Orders have come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control areas, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10, unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Orders will not come into operation before the 1st day of May 1965, or before a later
