NEW TOWNS ACT 1946

The Washington New Town (Designation) Order 1964

1. Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government, in exercise of his powers under section 1 of the New Towns Act, 1946 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, on 24th July 1964 made an Order designating as the site of a proposed new town an area comprising approximately 5,300 acres of land in the administrative county of Durham, situate partly in the urban districts of Washington and Houghton-le-Spring and partly in the rural district of Chester-le-Street, which land is shown on the map annexed to the Order.

2. In compliance with the provisions of paragraph 5 of Schedule 1 to the Act, a copy of the Order and a copy of the map have been deposited at the following places where they may be inspected at all reasonable hours without payment of fee:

Town and Country Planning Act 1962

Leighton Buzzard, Beds.

Town and Country Planning Act 1962

Bristol
