MIRFIELD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Mirfield No. 6 Smoke Control Order, 1964

Notice is hereby given that the Mirfield Urban District Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 22nd day of July 1964, made an Order entitled the Mirfield No. 6 Smoke Control Order, 1964, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of October 1965, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Mirfield, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 25th day of July 1964.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

All that area comprising approximately 201.30 acres of land more particularly delineated on the plan attached to the Order, being bounded on the west and south-west by Sunnyband Road, Greenside Road, Jenny Lane and Wellhouse Lane; on the south by a footpath leading from Wellhouse Lane to Crossley Lane, Crossley Lane, Primrose Lane and Jill Lane to the U.D. Boundary at Spen Back; on the east by Spen Beck along the U.D. Boundary, and on the north by the U.D. Boundary from Spen Back to Leeds Road near the Fountain Inn.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from

a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of November 1965, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Mitcham, Surrey, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 7th day of August 1964.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area comprising that part of the Mitcham (Central) Ward contained within a line commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the Borough at the centre of Grove Road, thence generally in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Grove Road to a point opposite the centre of Meopham Road, thence generally in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Meopham Road and Rowan Road to a point opposite the centre of Northborough Road, thence generally in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Northborough Road to the eastern boundary of the Borough, thence generally in a north-westerly, north-easterly and westerly direction along the boundary of the Borough to the point of commencement.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before 1st October 1965, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Urban District Council of Barnet, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 7th August 1964.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

That area in the Urban District of Barnet bounded on the west by a line down the centre of Bells Hill southwards to the point of junction with Chesterfield Road, and thence along the centre of Chesterfield Road to the point of junction with Mays Lane;
