The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallant and distinguished services in the Borneo Territories.

Military Cross

Captain (Q.G.O.) AITASING GURUNG (456046) 1st Battalion, 2nd King Edward VII's Own Gurkha Rifles (The Sirmoor Rifles).

Captain Aitasing Gurung was second-in-command of D Company in September 1963 when his Company Commander was accidentally wounded on patrol and evacuated by air. He took command and for over two months led the Company on jungle operations

against Indonesian terrorists. On 2nd September a platoon of C Company encountered an enemy force over thirty strong and killed six. Captain Aitasing followed the tracks of the retreating enemy force until nightfall. A hut was found in the area containing rice and knowing the enemy to be short of food an ambush was placed on it. The following morning Captain Aitasing accompanied by his Orderly went to inspect the ambush position. On the way they suddenly came across two armed terrorists. In an exchange of fire Captain Aitasing killed both of them one of whom later proved to be the leader of the terrorist group.

His Company was then involved in a long series of deep jungle operations in very remote, rugged terrain. Throughout these operations Captain Aitasing set an example to his men by his courage, leadership and cheerful spirit.

Lieutenant (Q.G.O.) PASBAHADUR GURUNG (465448) 1st Battalion, 2nd King Edward VII's Own Gurkha Rifles (The Sirmoor Rifles).

On the 28th September 1963 an enemy force, estimated to be between two and three hundred strong, attacked a Border Scout outpost at Long Jawi in Sarawak. Three days later Lieutenant Pasbahadur Gurung, commanding No. 11 Platoon, carefully disposed his men in position to ambush the intruders making use of the River Balui as an escape route. Shortly after dark the sounds of an outboard motor and voices were heard. After a few minutes two boats, each carrying thirteen to fifteen men and moving some fifty yards apart approached the position. Moonlight reflected from the water revealed that the occupants were armed and in uniform. Fire was opened, at a range of 25 yards, when the first boat was opposite the last ambush position. Four fifths of the terrorists were killed by fire or drowned in the fast flowing river. The boat came to rest down stream and from it, later, a mortar and much enemy equipment were recovered.

The engine of the second boat was stopped when firing started but it drifted backwards under the first ambush position where it was raked with fire from stern to stern before it disintegrated. There could have been no survivors.

This completely successful ambush of escaping marauders owed its effectiveness to the courageous and determined leadership and military skill of Lieutenant Pasbahadur Gurung.

Military Medal

21134797 Corporal TEJBAHADUR GURUNG, 1st Battalion, 2nd King Edward VII's Own Gurkha Rifles (The Sirmoor Rifles).

On 28th September 1963 Corporal Tejbahadur Gurung was commander of a mixed force of six

Gurkhas, three Policemen and twenty-one Border Scouts at Long Jawi, a long house village some forty miles from the Indonesian Border. Just before first light he heard that Indonesians were about to attack. He immediately ran to the Scouts hut to give the alarm. Whilst doing so he was subjected to machine gun fire but succeeded in reaching the summit of the hill on which the hut was situated. Here, under heavy fire he organised the defence.

The enemy brought heavy fire to bear on the position with small arms, a medium machine gun and a sixty-millimetre mortar, killing one Gurkha and one Border Scout. At the same time they attacked and killed both the Gurkha and the Police radio operators in a little hut, thus preventing news of the attack being given. The Border Scouts withdrew into the jungle; there were left behind four Gurkhas, one policeman and one Border Scout to hold the position. Of these two were wounded. Corporal Tejbahadur rallied this small force and held the crest of the hill for three hours against a well armed force of over one hundred. It was subsequently found that five enemy had been killed and an unknown number wounded.

When their ammunition was almost exhausted Corporal Tejbahadur withdrew his force, tactically, to a position on a hill about a thousand yards away, from which he observed the enemy and gathered much useful information. Under cover of darkness he then led his men through uncharted jungle for three days and reported to the nearest military post. Throughout the action, Corporal Tejbahadur kept command of the situation conducting the defence with great skill and courage, and finally withdrawing in good order with all survivors and weapons.

21138535 Lance Corporal (Acting Corporal) BALMAN GURUNG, 2nd Battalion, 6th Queen Elizabeth's Own Gurkha Rifles.

On the 22nd August 1963, No. 1 Platoon on patrol in Sarawak after a difficult approach march, arrived in the vicinity of an enemy camp.

During the tactical clearance of the area the terrorists, who earlier had withdrawn to a hidden position, opened fire, mortally wounding a Border Scout at Corporal Balman's side. Undeterred he immediately charged the enemy but was badly wounded in the thighs and arms by a grenade thrown in his path. His rifle also was hit causing it to jam. Despite his wounds and unserviceable weapon Corporal Balman continued to lead his men towards the enemy. Finally he was ordered by his Platoon Commander to withdraw to the rear to have his wounds dressed. Only then did this brave Corporal relinquish the command of his section.

Corporal Balman's disregard for his own safety was an inspiration to his men. It contributed greatly to maintaining the momentum of the attack, the success of which was mainly due to his great courage, determination and devotion to duty.

Distinguished Flying Medal

23220272 Corporal (Acting Sergeant) Martin Roger NICHOLS, Corps of Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers, attached to Army Air Corps.

During the period October 1962 to October 1963 Sergeant Nichols was engaged almost continually on operational flying in North Borneo, Brunei and Sarawak. Prior to the outbreak of the Brunei rebellion he was engaged on anti-piracy operations flying for many long hours in a single-engined aircraft unescorted and over the sea.

Since the outbreak of the rebellion, apart from short periods of rest, he has been continuously flying in support of operations in the Borneo Territories and has amassed the impressive total of 395 operational flying hours.

This flying involved operations over formidable mountainous jungle covered country, frequently in tropical weather inimical to flying. Inadequate radio communications in the area made it impossible to provide even the basic requirements of a flight safety system. The airstrips to which he operated were remote and marginal.

Despite these conditions and the resultant strain Sergeant Nichols cheerfully volunteered for more than his share of flying duty and on occasions when shortage of pilots was acute he exceeded the limit of flying hours allowed over a set period and had to be ordered to rest. His sorties included close visual reconnaissance over the jungle, supply dropping and troop lifts, casualty evacuations, flare dropping and night reconnaissance and leaflet drops.

Sergeant Nichols showed the highest qualities of pilot skill and airmanship, resourcefulness, initiative and zeal. He displayed a high degree of courage and determination in completing his tasks in the face of rapidly changing and adverse flying conditions.
