Genoa, June 9. N.S. Dr. Newton, Envoy Extraordinary from the Queen of Great Britain, is on his Departure for Florence, having been treated during his stay here with particular Marks of Distinction. His tiest Addrences were attended with unusual Honours; the Republick being willing to shew their great Respect to Her Majesty in the Terson of Her Minister. Litters were provided by the Republick for the Gentlemen that were with him, who waited upon him to his House. This Entry was attended by a greater Number of Nobility than has before been known at any in Genoa.
