St. James's Palace, London S.W.1. 15th December 1964.

The Queen has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the British Empire Medal for Gallantry (Military Division) to the undermentioned:

3142674 Acting Sergeant George Henderson PATERSON, Royal Air Force.

On the 13th April 1964 the Mountain Desert Rescue team went to Mukeiras to recover the body of an Army officer who had fallen whilst climbing. The body was lodged on a 3 foot wide ledge some 450 feet from the top of a sheer 3,000 foot face of both sound and unsound old granite rock. The route chosen was along a dried up waterfall to the main face, then 250 feet along a ledge in parts only 8 inches wide, with a sheer drop of 2,400 feet. In spite of this frightening prospect and a temperature of 100°F. Sergeant Paterson made a reconnaissance to the body but the onset of darkness prevented recovery that night. The next morning Sergeant Paterson led his team over the same route which took some 4½ hours. After a rest the team carried their 11-stone burden back along the narrow ledge, taking 3½ hours and a further 3 hours on the second stage to the top of the escarpment. The onlookers were full of praise for the skill and stamina of the team during this task which was frightening and unknown to them and entailed a long 13½ hours on the rock face, but the highest praise must go to Sergeant Paterson, not only for his leadership, but for his personal reconnaissance the previous afternoon, without which the recovery of the body would have been impossible.
