Reduction of E.F.T.A. rates of import duty

The reduction is one-fourth of the current Convention rate of duty except in the following cases:

(a) certain fish and marine products, which become free of duty consequent upon an undertaking given to Norway;

(b) centain goods containing hydrocarbon oils, for which the rates of 7 per cent., 5½ per cent., 2½ per cent. and 1½ per cent. are reduced to 6½ per cent., 4 per cent., 1½ per cent. and 1 per cent. respectively.
