CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATHS ORDER

*Hollingbourn Rural District (Bicknor No. 1) Public
Paths Extinguishment Order, 1964*

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th day of January 1965, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

Its effect is to extinguish the following lengths of public rights of way:

- (a) *Footpath No. 164*: A length of footpath commencing at a point near St. James's Church in the north-western corner of O.S. Parcel 26 and running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 210 yards to the unclassified road at Court Lodge.
- (b) *Footpath No. 167*: A length of footpath commencing at a point on the road B.2163, approximately 500 yards east-north-east of Cooper's Farm, and running in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 280 yards and thence in a north-easterly direction for approximately 700 yards to a right angle bend on the unclassified road approximately 80 yards south-west of Bicknor Cottages.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, 73 College Road, Maidstone, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 2nd day of February 1965, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

*Highways Act 1959, section 108 and 12th Schedule**Notice of proposal to apply for Orders authorising
the stopping up of sections of highways*

Notice is hereby given that the Keighley Borough Council being the Highway Authority for the highways hereinafter mentioned intend to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Courts, Devonshire Street, Keighley, on Tuesday, the 2nd day of March 1965, at the hour of 10.30 in the forenoon for Orders under section 108 of the Highways Act 1959, authorising the stopping up of the sections of highways referred to in the Schedule hereto on the ground that the said sections of highways are unnecessary.

2. The length of Brunswick Street from the far southerly junction with Fly Street and Bee Street to Bow Street, a distance of 217 feet or thereabouts.
3. The length of Bow Street lying between Adelaide Street and Hanover Street, a distance of 101 feet or thereabouts.
4. The length of Bee Street lying between Adelaide Street and Brunswick Street, a distance of 38 feet or thereabouts.

5. The length of Fly Street lying between Brunswick Street and Hanover Street, a distance of 39 feet or thereabouts.

*Repton Rural District Council (Repton)
Extinguishment Order, 1964*
