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Falmouth, Jan. 12.

Yesterday put to sea the *Richard* and *Bonadventure* and several other ships bound for several Ports of France, but meeting with contrary winds at sea, are this day put back again into Harbor.

The *Frederick* of New York is sailed for Holland, and the *Nathaniel* and *Abigail* for London.

Lyme, Jan. 17. The 15th instant arrived here the *Windfor* of this place from *Morlatx*, whose people tell us, that before their departure from that Port, the Magistrates had by beat of Drum and printed Papers fixed in publick places published the Kings allowance of 5 Liures the Tun for all ships of above 100 Tuns which should be built by any private persons, or brought in to serve upon the account of Trade, with a severe Order against such French Seamen as should not quit the service of any foreign Princes and return home to the service of their own Country.

They farther inform, that three of the biggest ships are fitted up at *Brest*, and are ready to put to sea for the guard of the Coasts, and that a great Fleet is fitting up against the *Spring*.

Alicans, Dec. 2. Yesterday arrived in this Road Sir *Tho. Allen* on the *Resolution*, and with him the *Portland*, *Forefight*, and *Little Victory*, having since he cleaved at *Porto Mohut* shown himself before the Port of *Algiers* and ranged the coasts of *Barbary* as far as *Oran*, giving chase to several of the Enemy: he has since dispatched a vessel to Captain *Clerks* Squadron cruising to the Eastwards, with whom he designs to return again to the coasts of *Barbary* to attend the motion of the Corsairs before the Ports of *Argiers* and *Cercelli*, at the latter of which places these Pyrats usually call in for intelligence before they dare adventure to their own Port.

The *Portsmouth* and *Milford* gave lately chase to Two small Turkish men of war off *Malaga*, who being hardly prest, the lesser one of 8 Guns became prize, but the men saved themselves in the greater, which made an escape: this week the same Fregats took another prize from the Turks being a vessel of 6 Guns 4 Murthers and 60 men.

The French Commander d' *Almeras* is with a Squadron of 16 sail of men of war with their attendants at *Tuica*, where he is to open his Commission the 12th instant, and 'tis believed may be employ'd against the Turks of *Barbary* from whom they have received many affronts.

Genous, Jan. 8. The 1 instant the three Governours and the two Procurators who were elected Magistrates for the Government of this Republick in December made their first entry into the Pallace with the usual Ceremonies, where in the presence of the Colledge and the Nobility, an excellent Speech was made to them upon their Entry into the Government.

The 23d instant departed hence the *Pelican* Pink for *Legora* to enjoy the benefit of Convoy on her return home, the same day put in here by ill weather two French Gallies from *Thoulon*, having on board them the Cardinals *de Bouillon* and *de Retz* with the Duke *de Chaulnes* the French Ambassador, who growing impatient of the ill weather, fearing it might too long retard them in their voyage to *Rome*, they chose rather to go hence by Land in Chairs, having hired 32 Porters to carry them by turns:

the Gallies this morning returned again for *Toulon*, The Prince de *Monaco* Treated the Cardinals and Ambassador during their stay at his own house, receiving them with much more cheerfulness, his Princes having the last week made him Father to a young Prince.

We hear not of any farther disturbances upon the confines between the subjects of *Savoie* and those of this Republick; strong parties of soldiers being on both sides quartered about 5th *Remo* for the preservation of the peace.

The 4th instant in the Evening came in the *Morning Star* and the *Sarah* from *Newfoundland*, and the *Little welcome* from *Alicans* with *Pilchards*, having been conducted within sight of this Port by the *Falcon* and *Speedwel* Fregats who went for wards for *Legorn* with four other Merchants ships under their Convoy.

Two men of War belonging to this Republick are fitting up, intending for *Spain* for the security of their Traders, but will not be ready till the end of the next Month.

This State has resolved to employ *Carlo Ottone* as their Agent or Consul into *England*, a person of sincere abilities, who has been formerly employed by them in the same nature at *Rome*.

From *Rome* we are informed, that the 19th past Prince *D. Gio. Battista Rospiglioso* gave the first visit to his intended Spouse *Donna Maria Camilla Pallavicina*, who was lodged in the Pallace of the Cardinal her Uncle, that he had since made her a Present in Jewels to the value of 40 thousand Crowns, and that on the 22th of the same Month they intended to Solemnize the Marriage between them.

From *Turin* we are told, That the Duke and Duchesse of *Savoie* being perfectly confirmed in their healths, and much joyed at the recovery of the young Prince, whom they supposed to have been in a dangerous condition, On the 22th past entertained the whole Court with the Diversions of a Musical Opera, and a Grand Ballet, of excellent Contrivance and great Expence, wherein all the persons that were concern'd as Actors, made their several presents to the Duchesse.

The Count *Bigliastre* now Ambassador from the Duke of *Savoie* at *Venice*, but designed under the same Character for *Rome*, has been countermanded by several Courtiers, and is ordered to return home.

From *Milan* they tell us, that the Marquis *de los Balbaces Spinola* has upon the receipt of a second dispatch from the Court of *Spain*, made preparation for his voyage to *Vienna* whether he is designed Ambassador, expecting daily the arrival of the Duke d' *Ossuna*, who is to succeed in the Government, and for whose entertainment preparation is there making by a servant he has employ'd, and sent before him for that purpose.

'Tis confidently said, that the Prince *Fruilce* is to succeed in the Marquisses Charge of General of all the Horſes belonging to that Duchy, which he also resignes upon his Embassy.

Venice, Jan. 4. From *Ancona* we are informed, that many people are employed in fishing for the Guns and lading of the ship called the *Redeemer* which was unfortunately cast away near the shoar, near the Mountain *Pesaro*, where they had regained 34 pieces of Cloth of Gold and Silver designed for Presents in the Ottoman Court, and had hopes also to recover the Moneys and other things of value; they had also found the body of Signior *Ottavio Labia*

Labia one of the Gentlemen employ'd by the Senate for the distributing their Presents, which is deposited in the Church at *Rimini* till Order can be taken to bring it home to receive an entertainment suitable to his quality.

A considerable part of the remains of our Garrison of *Candia* is yet at *Zante*, where they expect the farther commands of the Senate, who have sometime since sent thither their Letters of thanks to the Captain General for all the excellent services performed by him during the late wars; ordering him in their name to acknowledge particularly the satisfaction they received in the faithful and prudent service of Colonel *Annand*, commonly called by them *Arnardi* or *Arnandi*, an English Officer, who had served them during the whole Siege of *Candia*, where he some time commanded a Regiment, giving many testimonies of his valour in the defence of the place, and of his prudence and address at the close of that long Siege, he being a person who with a Secretary which attended him was alone entrusted with the management of the Treaty for peace and the surrender of the place; and obtained those honourable Articles when the Garrison was no longer able to make resistance.

General *Barbaro* who some time since put to sea intending for *Dalmatia*, where he is to command in the room of General *Priuli*, the time of whose Government is expired, is safely arrived at *Zars*, whose welcome was there loudly proclaimed with the discharge of all their Artillery, all the Horse were upon his arrival drawn out to attend him into the Town, and the Foot placed in their best Order upon the walls, entertained him with the peals and volleys of shot: The winter being so far advanced, he intends to defer his progress till the Spring for the visiting of the several Towns and Fortifications of his New Government, contenting himself in the mean time to send his Commissary to take a view of the forces of that Province, and to distribute the Moneys which he brought over with him for their pay.

Signior *Andrea Vallier*, Proveditor of the 3 Islands, is suddenly expected home. This Republick putting an end to his Charge, and leaving the Government of those Islands, according to ancient Custom in time of Peace, to the care of particular Proveditors. They have made choice of Signior *Antonio Vandrani* to be Proveditor of *Cephelonia*.

Vienna, Jan. 5. The Emperour is now well recovered of his distemper which for some days much disordered him and perplexed the whole Court, he has since been so well restored to his strength as to write Letters with his own hand to the King and Queen of *Spain*, and sign several dispatches to the Electors and other persons.

The Turkish Aga has taken his leave of the Count de *Monsecuculi* the President of the Council of war, and is since dismissed with Presents to his satisfaction, and Letters to the Visier of *Offen* in return to those he brought from him.

Our complaints are great from *Hungary* of several violencies committed by the Turks and their daily threats of making fresh invasions upon them, insomuch as several Towns upon the frontiers, and generally all the common people have joynd in a petition to the Emperour to send such a force to their assistance as may secure them from farther attempts and enable them to pay their Duty to the Emperour.

From *Fresbourg* we are told that a young fellow of 24 years of age who was formerly a servant to the Count de *Forgatz*, went away from *Friesstadt* about the 5th of the last month and put himself into *Neubausel*, and by his addresses got to be entertain'd as a servant in the house of *Ali Bassa* the Commander of the Janiaries, where for some time he acted the part of a diligent servant, till laying hold of an opportunity he killed the Commander with his Wife and Children and all those few servants that were that day left in the house, and then setting fire to the house made his escape by means of a Cart laden with Corn

which he pretended to drive to a Mill out of the Town, and returned again to *Friesstadt*.

The Resolution still continues for the departure of the Arch-Duchess the Emperours sister, and the intended Queen of *Poland*, about the end of this Month on her way for *Poland*, to whom has been assign'd the sum of 250 thousand Liures for her private expences, and the sum of 250 thousand Rixdollers as one half of her Portion. The Bishop of *Olmuz* is design'd to perform the Ceremonies of their Marriage, and the Count de *Sinzenborff* to attend her in the Quality of her Major Domo, till she be received by the Commissioners appointed by the King of *Poland* to receive her upon the Frontiers.

Hague, Jan. 21. The States of *Ovryssel* having drawn a considerable strength into all their frontier Towns and furnished them with a sufficient quantity of all necessary provisions, are become less jealous of their Neighbours, and have given the States here an account of the posture of their affairs, whereupon the forces which were design'd to have march'd to their assistance but were stopp'd by the late frosts, are countermanded.

The States of *Holland* will not meet before *February*, but their Deputies are in daily conference with the Commissioners of the Admiralty about *Maritime* affairs and the securing of our Trade, especially against the Corsairs of *Barbary* who are numerous at sea, and are ordered not to appear less than four together, and to set upon all Convoys.
