The QUEEN has been graciously pleased, on the advice of Her Majesty's Canadian Ministers, to give orders for the undermentioned award of the British Empire Medal.

*Awarded the British Empire Medal for Gallantry (Civil Division):*

MAYNARD BOBBITT, Woodcutter and Fisherman, Harrington Harbour, Quebec.

A man travelling by dog team from Aylmer Sound to Harrington Harbour, Quebec, was approximately two miles off-shore when the ice broke under him and he and his dog team fell into the water. He tried to climb out but the ice kept breaking away. He was able to keep afloat by means of the sleigh. Mr. Bobbitt and his son, also travelling by dog team, came upon the scene shortly thereafter. Mr. Bobbitt released his own dogs and had them taken back to shore by his son, keeping his sleigh with him. Mr. Bobbitt attempted to reach the man on foot, but the ice kept bending under his weight, threatening to break. Realising that he could not succeed in this manner, he decided to use the sleigh

for support. Keeping one knee on the ice and the other on the sleigh to prevent it from drifting in the high wind, Mr. Bobbitt inched his way over the treacherous ice towards the hole in the ice. He finally got within reaching distance and succeeded after three attempts in passing a rope to the man and pulling him out of the water.
