Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853, 16 & 17 Vict. c. 134, and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is advice of Her Privy Cour. hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the said Churchyard of St. Mary's Church, Hadlow, Tonbridge, in the said County.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Churchyard of St. Mary's Church, Hadlow, Tonbridge, Kent) Order, 1965.
