## ISLE OF WIGHT RIVER AND WATER AUTHORITY

*Water Act, 1945*

Notice is hereby given that the Isle of Wight River and Water Authority (hereinafter referred to as "the Authority") intend to apply to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for an Order to amend the Isle of Wight Water Board Order, 1956 (which authorised the construction of a storage reservoir of approximately 1,500,000 gallons capacity on land at Alvington Down in the Borough of Newport being part of Enclosure numbered 674 on the 1/2500 Ordnance Map Sheet XCV.5 Hampshire (Isle of Wight) Edition 1908), to the effect that the permitted capacity of the reservoir so authorised shall be increased to approximately 2,500,000 gallons.

A copy of the draft Order and a plan showing the aforementioned land has been deposited for public inspection at the County Hill, Newport, and may be inspected by any person free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. for a period of 28 days from the date of the first publication of this notice. Copies of the draft Order may be purchased on application to the Acting Clerk of the Authority; at the County Hall aforesaid at the price of 1s. a copy.

Notice of the intended application and an explanation of the extent of the proposed Order will be first published in the Isle of Wight County Press newspaper on the 3rd April 1965.

## DEWSBURY COUNTY BOROUGH

*The Dewsbury (Thornhill) Smoke Control Order 1965*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Dewsbury in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 4th day of March 1965, made an Order entitled the Dewsbury (Thornhill) Smoke Control Order, 1965, declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Attention is drawn to the fact that the Council have, in accordance with section 95 (2) of the Housing Act, 1964, designated the following types of grates as being unsuitable for installation under the Clean Air Act, 1956, due to supplies of soft coke and premium fuels being insufficient for the area, namely (1) Inset open grates (with the exception of underfloor draught fires) and (2) Conversion units for combination grates capable of burning only open grate fuels, e.g. coal, soft coals and premium smokeless fuels.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of October, 1968, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order (and of the Map referred to therein) may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Dewsbury, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 3rd day of April, 1965.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by Notice in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1 object to the confirmation of the Order.

The Dewsbury (Thornhill) Smoke Control Order, 1964, made by the Council on the 5th day of November 1964, is hereby revoked.

## SCHEDULE

An area of approximately 3,180 acres of land bounded on or towards the North partly by the River Calder from Greenwood Lock to the Railway Bridge crossing the said River and carrying the Ravensthorpe Branch Railway Line and then proceeding along such Railway Line to the Borough Boundary at the point where it crosses the River Calder and then on the East South and West sides by the Borough Boundary to the said Greenwood Lock, which said area is more particularly delineated and shown coloured green on the plan annexed to the said Order.
