

HUYTON-WITH-ROBY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

*The Huyton-with-Roby Urban District Council
(Area No. 4) Smoke Control Order, 1964*

Notice is hereby given that the Huyton-with-Roby Urban District Council in exercise of their powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 22nd day of December 1964 made an Order entitled the Huyton-with-Roby Urban District Council (Area No. 4) Smoke Control Order, 1964, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke, and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Huyton at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 12th day of April 1965.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

On the 16th March 1965, the Council designated the following class of heating appliances for the purpose of section 95 (2) of the Housing Act, 1964, as being in the Council's opinion unsuitable for installation in the area of the Huyton-with-Roby Urban District Council (Area No. 4) Smoke Control Order, 1964, as tending by reason of its consumption of fuel to impose undue strain on the fuel resources of the said area, namely, all appliances designed to burn coke or anthracite unless they are designed and installed with adequate draught and other arrangements to burn all types (but not every size) of coke and anthracite which are capable of being burned in a domestic heating or cooking appliance. This designation means that grant will not be payable on the ordinary improved open grate.

Air Act, 1956, on the 22nd day of March 1965, made an Order entitled the City of Manchester (Tamworth Street, Hulme) Smoke Control Order, 1965, declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of June 1966, or before a later date determined under the provisions of the Clean Air Act, 1956.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Parliamentary Section (Room 115), Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Manchester, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 9th April 1965.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area to which the Order relates is situated in the city of Manchester and is bounded on the north by Stretford Road, on the east by Upper Moss Lane, on the south by Moss Lane West, and on the west by the city boundary; the smoke control area is about 39 acres in extent and is more particularly indicated on the map referred to in the Order.
